

Understanding College Drop Out

24% OF COLLEGE STUDENTS DROP OUT IN THE FIRST YEAR

Drop-out rates can be influenced by many factors such as:

- Financial concerns
- Academic struggles
- Poor habits
- Social & emotional challenges

47% OF COLLEGE STUDENTS GRADUATE IN 4 YEARS

THESE FIGURES HAVE STEADILY INCREASED OVER THE LAST DECADE

Planning & resiliency can significantly reduce the likelihood of drop out

- Parents can play a key role by helping talk through realistic college expectations & encourage the development of building skills in independence.
- Build time management skills
- Create strong study habits
- Maintain a support network






Primary Factors

- Quality/Rigor of Academic

- Performance (Grades, GPA, Rank)
- Test Scores (SAT, ACT, optional?)

Additional Factors

- Extracurricular Activities
- Essay/Short answer Qs
- Letters of Recommendation
- Demonstrated Interest

SAT now digital!

Students must install Bluebook app, practice using the software prior to taking the exam. What to expect on test day

•<u>3 Sections</u>:

- •Math
- Reading
- •Writing & Language
- •Length: self-paced. Leave when complete (by noon)

•Score Range: 200-800 per section, 400-1600 overall

<u>ACT</u>

- **4 Sections:** English, Math, Reading & Science and an optional writing test
- Length: 4 hours
- Score Range: 1-36 per section, Composite score range from 1-36 (average of scores on the 4 subject tests)

<u>SAT Prep – Khan Academy, Practice Tests</u>



- Speak with your student now about financing college...always have one safety school (specifically for cost factor) RACC is a smart option!
- Determine all college expenses (not just tuition)
- Estimate your family's expected contribution (no longer called the EFC, now the <u>Student Aid Index, SAI</u>)
- Search for scholarships including <u>Hamburg's Counseling</u>
 <u>Department's Scholarship Webpage</u> Esther Ludwig (85% or 80%gpa)
- Complete FAFSA (opening date possibly Oct 1 but this year was delayed to December/ use 2023 tax returns) <u>www.fafsa.gov</u>
- Attend financial aid workshop in the county: <u>RACC</u>, <u>Albright</u>, <u>Kutztown</u>, etc.



BIG FUTURE SCHOLARSHIPS-COLLEGEBOARD

How can students <u>participate?</u>

- Students can return to the homepage to opt into the program via their College Board account.
- Specifically for juniors
- Students can opt-out if they no longer wish to participate

The Scholarships

The more effort you put in, the more opportunities you have to earn a scholarship. Complete all six, and you're eligible to earn \$40,000. Scholarships will be awarded through monthly drawings to students who complete each action.

2. Practice for the SAT: \$1,000 Use Official SAT Practice on Khan Academy® to get ready for test day. Learn More

3. Improve Your Score: \$2,000 Show how practice pays off by improving your SAT score. Learn More

4. Strengthen Your College List: \$500 Make sure your college list has a mix of academic safety, fit, and reach schools. Learn More

5. Complete the FAFSA: \$1,000 Fill out the free government form to apply for financial aid. Learn More

Apply to the schools you want to attend. Learn More

Complete Your Journey: \$40,000 Complete all six scholarship steps to be eligible for a \$40,000 scholarship. Learn More
