

# Student Spotlight: Conley Yellets Justin Hoy - 11

After reviewing the Hamburg School District organized plans, guidelines, and protocols for certain situations (although being a bit concerned for other people and his own families safety), he decided to go back to school at the beginning of the second quarter. Conley stated that "having a set schedule motivated me to even get out of bed in the morning" unlike what virtual had been for the frustrating two months that he had taken the course. Conley also commended the schools handling of certain outbreaks in November, December, and January, stating that he still learned the same amount, if not more information easily while doing Hamburg's virtual classes compared to the strange transitioning of virtual learning with another education organization.

Although dealing with the pandemic, Conley has stated that his experiences have been somewhat difficult, especially with the continued coverage of negative events occurring in the nation, but he still has a positive outlook on the events that he is receiving at Hamburg. He continues to have a positive outlook despite the personal issues and situations that he worries about, the main concern being spreading the Coronavirus not just to his family but also to other people in the community (feeling guilty of the potential negative consequence of spreading the disease). Hamburg has continued to frenforec, through their Coronavirus guidelines, Conley's opinion of safely learning in-person in the district (with a multitude of better educational benefits compared to virtual learning).

So far, Conley's experiences have been positive while returning to in-person learning, being more motivated, social with his friends (which he hasn't seen in months before school), and receiving a better education than he would with the difficult, stressful, and frustrating virtual learning transition. His opinion of Hamburg has also increased since he has returned to the district in-person from not contracting the Coronavirus from their quick, efficient, and safe virtual planning or announcements. He has regained his motivation for school, continues to get good grades, and is enjoying his most stress-free time of life while being a junior. With a very optimistic outlook, Conley commends Hamburg for the organized plans and responses to Coronavirus outbreaks, attempting to protect the entire community, while at the same time providing above average education, motivating, preparing, and encouraging young adults to better their lives in the future through Hamburg's given opportunities of education.



Read Across America Week has been celebrated each year since 1998 and is always on the same week as the infamous children's book writer, Dr. Seuss's, birthday. Across the country, students and teachers read classic tales like One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish and The Lorax in order to share



their love of reading. This year, Read Across America Week kicked off on March 2. The NEA (National Education Association) launched this nostalgic week of reading in order to support their initiative of bettering public education, especially for elementary-age students. This organization has helped plan events such as school book clubs in order to promote reading at a young age. In addition to teachers, celebrities from across the nation have teamed up with the NEA to ensure a brighter future for America's youth. In 2010, first lady Michelle Obama read at the Library of Congress, and in 2011 Uma Therman, Mark Ruffalo, and Keri Russell helped launch a Read Across America program at the New York Public Library.

Dr. Seuss is one of the most popular children's book authors in the United States. In total, Seuss wrote and illustrated 45 books, which sold over 650 million copies. In addition to his widespread popularity, he won many awards, including the Pulitzer Prize Special Citation Award and the Caldecott Medal. Surprisingly, though, his most popular works are those published prior to 1970, these being The Cat in the Hat, Green Eggs and Ham, and How the Grinch Stole Christmas! His pen name, however, dates back even further. The name Dr. Seuss, created in 1927, was actually a joking reference to his father who wanted him to become a doctor. Seuss's real name is Theodor Seuss Geisel.

While it may seem as though high schoolers have grown out of Seuss's wondrous stories, many still think of them as their favorite childhood books. "I read them to my brothers when they were little." Angelina Carsto, 10, states. "I liked the rhymes in them, even though they did not always make sense."

Aislynn Ney,11, liked Dr. Seuss as a child because it brought her joy of reading to life. "They always bring a smile to a child." says the Hamburg junior. While Seuss passed away almost 20 years ago, his memory still lives on inside his creative works of art.

# Is social media a positive outlet for teens anymore?

Swipe, Click, Like, Friend, Search; These are just some of the things that the hu-

man race does daily, especially when it involves younger generations on social media platforms like Facebook, Instagram, or Twitter. Technology in general has become increasingly prominent in the lives of young people more and more each year, whether it is introducing laptops into elementary school classrooms or even adapting certain apps into kid-friendly platforms, such as Messenger Kids created by Facebook. The thought of social media is a pleasant one at first; as who would not want a place to communicate with friends from a distance or see what their favorite Kardashian is up to? However, many have turned away from the trending apps because negativity has them feeling the technology blues.



Founded in 2004, Facebook was the original place to keep up with friends and family from across the nation. After all, the original mission statement from creator Mark Zuckerburg was, "To give people the power to share and make the world more open and connected." However, over the years, many have turned to the site to express their opinions on politics, religion, health, or any other topic that may create controversy, rather than simply liking a photo of their aunt's new puppy. 2.7 billion users later, and Facebook is dominating the social media competition. While this sounds pretty positive, it has allowed even more room for altercations to arrive because the easier it is to contact a person with a different view, the easier it is to create an argument. Adding children to sites like this now exposes them to cyberbullying, self-absorption, and the idea that arguing over the phone is an effective way to express an opinion, each of which are not necessarily a healthy influence on younger people.

In the following years, similar apps developed, like Twitter in 2006 and Instagram in 2010, each of which have offered the same source of disputes, and are even more popular among teenagers. According to the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, 51% of teenagers visit social media sites daily. This means that over half of teens are being exposed to hate comments, photos that diminish the character of others, and videos that can be inappropriate, every single day. Is this the proper way of teaching children how to behave?

The majority of Hamburg Area High School students use social media sites and the opinions of these sites tend to be similar. "I don't like how easy it is to cyberbully," says Kamryn Smith, 11, "and also how it creates tons of insecurities because people only post when they look good or feel happy, making others feel like they or their life isn't good enough."

Emily Geib, 10, sees some positive uses of social media but does understand that there are some downsides. "I like that you can use it to communicate with a bunch of other people, but I dislike it because of all the cyberbullying." In an increasingly negative world, social media may not be the appropriate outlet as it was just a few years ago.

# Album/CD review: Your City Gave Me Asthma

What many think of when they hear the word album, is a series of songs placed within a playlist created by a band. The band may have up to, or more than four members, excluding producers, managers, publicists, and booking agents. However, rarely do we see an album such as, *Your City Gave Me Asthma*, be so successful and

get released by just one single person making their own music without any help. Will Gold, a 24 year old British musician, better known as Wilbur Soot on YouTube, is the individual responsible for developing such a success. Will started out his musical career only four years ago when he was 20 years old, picking up the guitar for the first time. Through perseverance and determination, he was able to gain the musical talents necessary to appeal to a broad audience. Just six months into learning guitar he released a video of his first ever song on YouTube. Though not an initial hit, it paved the way for many of his future videos and songs that would be successful. Many of Will's songs in this album are based on his real life experiences, from lost crushes in high school, to the city he lived in for many years, London. The style of music is best considered as homemade indie that is based around unique acoustic/vocal elements that brings the music to life. Every lyric evokes emotion and every verse is beautifully sung with meaning.

Your City Gave Me Asthma, starts off with the song, Jubilee Line, that slowly increases in power throughout. The song consists of Will's vocals along with a custom acoustic guitar pattern. By the end of the song, the intensity increases dramatically into a punk rock like chorus. Lyrically, it can be speculated that it is in the first person perspective of the singer where he explains the relationship between himself and his home London. The vocalist is clearly desperate, and yearns to escape the dreadful feeling of being locked in the city. He uses London's underground railway system, the jubilee line, as a metaphor to an invisible barrier surrounding him as seen from the lyrics, "There's a reason London puts barriers on the tube line."

Another song in the album, Since I Saw Vienna, is a song that maintains a sad, soft, and mellow toned vibe from start to finish. Will sings about how he is nothing compared to the one he loves. The lyrics, "The cute bomber jacket you've had since sixth form, Adorned with patches of places you've been," is Will explaining what the girl he loved used to wear and how he is attracted to her. Also in the lyrics, "I'm not a man of substance, and so I'll pretend," is Will explaining how he does not have the substances needed to appeal to her standards so he will instead pretend to be someone he is not.

Lastly, the song, Your Sister Was right, also holds a deeper meaning than what may be initially inferred. Will sings about how he can no longer love anymore, perhaps after a failed relationship from over obsessive behavior. The lyrics, "I can't find the perfect match, Abuse those I love, While I ostracize the ones who love me," represent how he cannot maintain a healthy relationship and the struggles his mind faces when he is in one. The character being portrayed ignores those who truly love him and persists to impress those who do not. Your Sister Was Right, musically starts off quite soft, but after a short period of time, very quickly becomes aggressive and drops straight into a long chorus. Often, Will's songs relate heavily to problems the youth of today face such as abusive relationships, feeling trapped, and in some cases, dangerous online activity.



#### New technology advances due to the Covid-19 pandemic

Along with the beginning of a new year, one can expect several new technological

advances to arise and with the world still suffering the effects of a pandemic, these advances are expected to aid the fight against Covid-19. Among other things, the drug industry has had a massive shakeup which promoted further research and development within the industry. This allowed for more efficient drug trials and provided speedy Covid-19 test kit developments all over the world, as well as the development of mRNA vaccines (Covid-19 vaccines), which are the first in human history and huge technological advancements.



Another technological advancement related to the pandemic is continued expansion of remote working and video conferencing. New companies such as Bluescape, Eloops, Figma, Slab, and Tandem are joining the bandwagon and have also created visual collaboration platforms. Also resulting from the pandemic, contactless delivery and shipping is predicted to remain as the new normal for 2021, which will greatly benefit companies, such as DoorDash, Postmates, Instacart, GrubHub, and Uber Eats. On top of this, some parts of the world like China are implementing contactless delivery through the use of autonomous vehicles to help fulfill grocery orders to customers. There are a few U.S. based companies that are working on doing the same thing using robotics and artificial intelligence-based applications.

With institutions related to health care pushing to lower the exposure of Covid-19 to patients and workers, many private and public practices telehealth offerings such as doctor-patient video chats. There has also been development of A.I. avatar-based diagnostics and no-contact based medication delivery. This has caused a 50% rise in telehealth visits in comparison to pre-pandemic statistics, which can be linked to public companies such as Teladoc Health, Amwell, Livongo Health, One Medical, and Humana, All of these companies continue to expand to meet the growing needs of today's society.

As for the youth of the current generation, Covid-19 has fast-tracked the e-learning and online learning industry. Because of the pandemic, 190 countries had to enforce nationwide school closures at some point, which affected nearly 1.6 billion people around the world. This promoted conducting classes via videoconferencing using various methods for schools, colleges, and even some coaching centers. This has made online learning much more popular because it allows for kids to stay home if they need to for safety reasons without compromising their education.

Hamburg Area High School has been taking full advantage of this new technology by implementing virtual learning on days that it is not safe for the students to be in school. Teachers are able to hold zoom meetings for their students and teach virtually, which would not be possible without the technological advancements due to the pandemic. ### Don't Miss Medici

Medici is a TV Show which displays captivating political intrigue or situations, political and economic corruption, and interesting sculpted art within a historical time period. This historical drama describes semi-historical events that occurred during this time in that region to the family. The family continues to gain power and influence over the city and region through its successful banking system, assisted by the influence of supportive factitious Popes in the Catholic faith (Rome), an increased respect by the people through economic success, and increased infrastructure and artistic architecture (which assists with their own reputation and people's opin-

ion of them in the region) which is funded by their influential banking system as well. The series was created by Frantz Sponitz in 2016, financially supported by Netflix. The show's production budget, for the first season, was around 24.2 million dollars (average estimates) and included eight episodes (which is the same amount of episodes for each season). The series was, mainly, filmed in the central Italian region of the historical setting and uses present-day Florence (with the exceptions of CGI exempting certain modern buildings). Although somewhat accurate with its setting with historical events that occur, there were a few buildings that were built af-

ter the setting of the story. Other than certain buildings not necessarily being historically in the story at that specific time period, the political situations and actions by the Medici family members is somewhat accurate, although dramatized for television.

The first season of the entire series is named Medici: Masters of Florence, depicting the first notable and recognizable historical person within the family named Cosimo de' Medici (or also called Cosimo the Elder). The season explains, within the first 2-3 episodes, the setting of the story, the family's situation in Florence, and the description of the characters like Cosimo. This person, considered the most influential Medicine for political and economic effects of the region during his life, is explained to love and enjoy the arts of a reinvigoration of Roman and Greek culture including music, literature, art, etc. After his fathers suspicious and sudden death, Cosimo becomes the leading member of his family's bank, gaining political influence in the council of Florence and becoming a prominent political figure in the city of Florence and the entire region of central Italy through his increase of trade in the region. Although corruptly benefiting his own bank through increased trade and financial investments, he invests some of his wealth into benefiting the people of Florence through artistic funding, literacy improvements, and a cultural revitalization, which is all fun died due to his continued interests in the arts and his generosity). The story then explains familial issues with marriages and other political situations within the city due to competing families wanting to gain political influence over the Medici from resentment of their economic gain and the lessening of their economic prosperity (wanting and motivated by economic gain). Although very immoral with his political gain, and his reaction towards certain political and economic competitors that threaten his political influence in Florence, Cosimo is considered one of the most influential people in that region at that time due to his increased interests of trade with foreign regions or nations, interests in the arts, and generosity towards funding certain projects within the city which benefits the people living their, all affecting the continuation and increase of the Renaissance through his funding of interests.

The second and third seasons of the series describe the life of Lorenzo de' Medici (Cosimo's grandson), becoming a prominent and influential person within Italian politics at the time and continuing the Medici tradition of banking and interests in trade (for personal economic gain). The second season mainly describes Lorenzo attempting to get out of his father's awful agreements with certain people, banks, businesses, nations, and art projects which has almost bankrupted their treasury and saved money. After his father's death, he attempts to save the bank through getting out of those agreements, politically and sometimes through threatening people physically. After stabilizing the bank's financial situation and gaining more wealth and political influence in the city, he then competes with rival family factions in the city for political influence. The rest of the season explains the rivalry between the two families for control over Florence and want of political, economic, and reputational gain (their own legacy). During the Pazzi Conspiracy, the rival family attempts to kill Lorenzo and the Medici family although only killing his brother. The plot is discovered and the accused are killed by a brutal hanging. This action shows the continued decrease of morality and personal motivation of Medici economic gain, political supremacy, and a personal legacy (potentially better than his predecessors).
