12th Fall

- Use the HAHS Counselors Webpage. LOTS of helpful information all available online. During COVID, it is invaluable to be resourceful and put it in the time to do your research.
- o HAHS Senior Presentation, Powerpoint: Available on the HS Counselor Webpage College & Career TAB
- o HAHS **Senior Parent Virtual Q&A**, Oct 27 @ 6pm or Oct 28 @ 9am (College information session)
- Dual Enrollment and AP registration deadlines...Check your emails, listen in Advisory, ask your counselor.
- Check out the virtual college fair opportunities: NACAC, PACAC, StriveScan- posted on HAHS Counselor Webpage
- Register for an SAT <u>www.sat.org</u> / or ACT <u>www.act.org</u> (Most Colleges are Test optional due to COVID)
 - ✓ Be sure to select "score recipients" to send your SAT and/or ACT scores so that the schools you are applying to receive both upcoming and past score reports. \$12/report and it takes weeks.
 - ✓ Hamburg Area HS CEEB code: 391620
- Take a full, challenging course load and keep working on your grades. Make sure you have taken the courses
 necessary to graduate in the spring.
- Continue to participate in extracurricular and volunteer activities. Demonstrate initiative, creativity, commitment, and leadership in each.
- Male students: you must register for selective service on your eighteenth birthday to be eligible for federal and state financial aid.
- Talk to counselors, teachers, and parents about your final college choices. **Apply to a minimum of 3 -5 schools no later than Thanksgiving.** (apply to a variety of schools including good match, safety, and reach)
- Make a calendar showing application deadlines for admission, financial aid, and scholarships.
- Complete application(s) and send all required documents (requirements may vary with each college):
 - Application: Complete online through college website OR Common Application
 - Application Fee: \$\$ Pay online for each application (some schools offer fee waivers)
 - o **Transcript:** Go to www.parchment.com to request official transcripts
 - SAT/ACT required?: Send test scores to colleges from the SAT or ACT site (CEEB code 391-620)
 - o **Essay/Personal Statement required?:** Make it exciting, have it proof-read
 - o **Portfolio? Writing Sample? Interview?:** Know the requirements
 - o Give your counselor any additional or required forms at least two weeks before they are due.
- Check resources and free internet sites for information on scholarships and grants (<u>www.cappex.com</u>, <u>www.hasdhawks.org</u> and <u>www.pheaa.org</u>). Do not pay for scholarship information. Ask colleges about scholarships for which you may qualify. Mrs. Fink updates the scholarship page on our website often.
- Give recommendation forms to the teachers you have chosen two weeks before you plan to send your application. Talk to your recommendation writers about your goals and ambitions.
- If you are able visit colleges in person or participate virtually. Pink College Visit form to excuse attendance on days that you miss school, located in Guidance Office.
- Fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid FAFSA http://www.fafsa.ed.gov after October 1.
- Complete the CSS Profile only if your school requires it. Visit www.collegeboard.org for the application.

12th Winter

- Consider an apprentice program: Carpenter Union (Lebanon & Allentown #167), Electrical (IBEW Local 743), Elevator Union (Local 84), Finishing Trades/Drywall (Council 21), Fire Sprinkler Union (#692), Ironworkers Union (Local 489), Plumbers (Local 524), Roofers (Local 30), Sheet Metal (Local 19-Hamburg location)....to name a few www.apprentice.org/northeast.html Contact Ms. Benz or Mr. Spohn for details!

 ROTC scholarship applications are due by December 1.
- Read the Counselor Connection page on our website monthly for important information and updates.
- o Check your email and admissions offices to ensure that you have provided all required materials to the college.
- Complete any remaining applications before <u>winter break</u>. Make sure you apply to at least one college that you know you can afford and where you know you will be accepted.
- Follow up by phone or e-mail and contact the colleges directly to make sure that they have received all
 application information, including recommendations and test scores. Keep in mind materials do take a few
 weeks to process as 'received' at the school.
- o If you have an 85% cumulative GPA or higher, be sure to complete the Esther Ludwig Scholarship Application before you leave for winter break. 80% cum GPA or higher for students attending trade/technical school.

12th Spring

- Compare the financial aid packages from the colleges and universities that have accepted you.
- Make your final college choice and send your deposit to by May 1.
- Be sure that you have received a FAFSA acknowledgment.
- o If you applied for a Pell Grant (on the FAFSA), you will receive the Student Aid (SAR) statement. Review this Pell notice, and forward it to the college you plan to attend. Make a copy for your record.
- Complete follow-up paperwork for the college of your choice (scheduling, orientation session, housing arrangements, and other necessary forms).
